Get the shots your child needs to go to school on time.

Immunizations protect your child from disease and cut down on sick visits to the doctor. Ask your child's health care provider about any required and recommended shots at every visit. Any dose not given at the recommended age should be given at the next visit, when possible.

immunization schedules are
specifically designed to provide
the safest protection when
children are most at-risk.

Children attending school in Florida (kindergarten through twelfth grade) must provide a Florida Certification of Immunization (DH 680 form), documenting up-to-date status for the following vaccinations:

- Diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (DTaP)
- Hepatitis B (Hep B)
- Polio (IPV)
- Measles-mumps-rubella (MMR)
- Varicella

In addition to kindergarten through twelfth grade vaccines, students entering or attending seventh grade must have a tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis (Tdap) vaccine.
